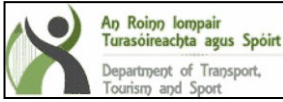

A VHF radio is a vital piece of safety equipment aboard a boat; anyone intending to go afloat should know how to operate one correctly. Under international law a boat's radio transmitter can only be operated by, or under the control of, someone who has an appropriate radio operators Certificate of Competency. A radio operator's certificate is a prerequisite for anyone undertaking the IS/RYA Coastal or Offshore exams and is required for many small commercial boats and fishing vessels.

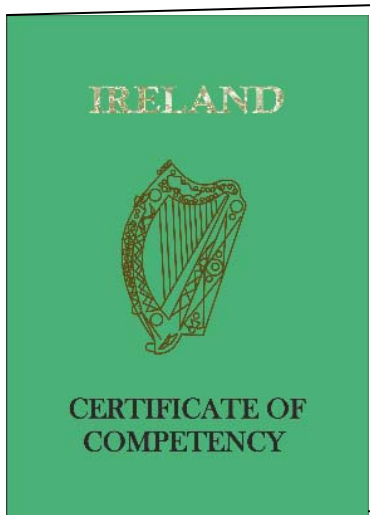
The Short Range Certificate, (SRC), is currently the appropriate VHF radio operators certificate for most leisure and small craft users and is necessary if applying for an Irish Ship Station licence, Call Sign and MMSI number.

Our radio courses cover the use of both fixed and portable hand held portable VHF radios and include a session devoted to practical hands on radio operation.
